

**THE TOWN OF CARMAN
BY-LAW #01/1839**

Being a by-law to regulate the use of firearms in Town.

WHEREAS Section 232(1) of The Municipal Act provides, in part

“A council may pass by-laws for municipal purposes respecting the following matters...

- j) the sale and use of firecrackers and other fireworks, the use of rifles, guns, and other firearms, and the use of bows and arrows and other devices;
- k) wild and domestic animals and activities in relation to them, including by-laws differentiating on the basis of sex, breed, size or weight;”

AND WHEREAS the Town of Carman is currently having problems with the number of crows in the Town,


AND WHEREAS Council is of the opinion that it is in the best interests of the community to provide controls to limit the number in Town,

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Town of Carman, duly assembled, enacts as follows:


1. THAT Animal Control Officers designated by the Town of Carman in writing, providing they have a current FAC permit, are hereby authorized to use a shotgun to control the crow and grackle population within the Town of Carman limits;
2. THAT the hours any of the above noted are permitted to discharge the firearms for the purpose of this by-law shall be one-half hour before sunrise and one-half hour after sunset.
3. THAT notification be given to the Carman office of the Pembina Valley Royal Canadian Mounted Police Detachment prior to commencing with the discharge of the firearm for the purpose of this by-law.

DONE AND PASSED, as a by-law of the Town of Carman, in the Province of Manitoba, this 12th day of April, A.D. 2001.
